In Japan, the image of the Eskimo (Inuit) people was created by Mr. Katsuichi Honda's documentary "Canadian Eskimos". They live in an ice igloo

(actually, that's made from packed snow house) and ate raw meat while butchering the animal. I remember, my first connection to the "Eskimo" is from a booklet that came with a magazine for elementary school students, featuring the peoples of the world. That booklet had Africa, Asia, or remote island people; I was most interested people living in the Arctic.

When Mr. Honda was visiting with them, they had not settled and living in family units with hunting. But after a few years, the Canadian government was to settle

them people down. Right now, no more people living old style.

When I read that book, I admired the people who lived in igloos, hunting in the bitter cold.

But it was an unfulfilled dream. Even our lives have changed drastically over the past 50 years, and the Eskimo lives have changed too. The world has changed so drastically, we can talk to the people in the Arctic on the web without a time difference from Japan.
